Be "In The Know" - The New GFWC Mobile Phone App Is Here And Ready for You To Install -



WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Take GFWC with you wherever you go with the newly released GFWC mobile phone application! The official app, available for iPhone iOS and Android, is your FREE on-the-go guide for everything GFWC. It has a variety of features which will help you quickly reference GFWC information, be notified of the latest GFWC announcements, network with your Federation sisters, and more!



Follow these steps to download the app on your phone:

Go to your phone's "App Store." For iPhone this is called the "App Store" and for Android this is called the "Google Play Store App."

Go to the store's search bar and search "GFWC." Do not search "General Federation of Women's Clubs" because it will not bring up any results.

One of the first results you will see will have the GFWC logo against a blue background. This is our app! Follow your phone's respective instructions for installing apps.

For iPhone, click the button that says "Get" or "Install." You will have to put in your Apple ID password before the app begins to

download. For Android, click the three dots next to the app. Then click "Install."

Once you set up your account, you will immediately have access to post on the activity feed and all of the other features on the app. You can make as many posts as you want, but remember to keep all of your posts related to your GFWC activities!

For a more thorough exploration of the app's features, read through the user guide which can be found here on GFWC.org. Living the Volunteer Spirit --GFWC Texas members (<u>You</u>) put WORDS into ACTION

ROWLETT -- GFWC Texas members visited the storm ravaged community of Rowlett on Thursday, February 18 after a statewide organizational campaign had been waged to gather contributions for victims of the December 26, 2015, tornadoes there. Over \$5,000 in cash and gift cards was presented to Rowlett Mayor Todd Gottel and Deputy Mayor Tammy Dana-Bashain to be distributed to area victims of the nine tornadoes reported by the National Weather Service in the Fort Worth area.

The funds are now part of the long term assistance available to uninsured and under insured who have been seriously affected where there are limited areas of help. Donations came, and are still coming in, from GFWC Texas clubs and individual members across Texas. Included was a generous donation from GFWC Alabama members. Thank you, Alabama!!

The cleanup process in Rowlett had begun only a few days prior to the GFWC Texas members' visit. Many families in and around Rowlett were left homeless and lost all their possessions. Eleven citizens lost their lives and two dozen were injured. The community at large was severely damaged. An estimate of 1,450 homes were damaged or destroyed. Other damages were to vehicles, other property in the private and public sector, public utilities.

The GFWC Texas members were lead on a car tour of some of the most hard struck neighborhoods. They drove by the iconic Rowlett water tower and watched as teams of teenaged young men ran debris filled wheelbarrow relay races that would end at roll off dumpsters, where they would be dumped, and speedily returned to where they had begun to fill again. The carnage was still mind boggling. As a "Thank You" to the delegation, a tour of one of the fire houses was arranged and a special treat was a ride on a fire truck. Rowlett Fire Chief Tommy Robinett and his wife, Christine, were hosts and instructors. Christine's daughter is a GRITS (junior club) member from Bowie.

If you, or your club, would like to donate to the Disaster Relief Fund you can mail directly to the Texas Federation Headquarters at 2312 San Gabriel, Austin, Texas 78705 or donate directly to the Go Fund Me account electronically go-fund.me/6cjhdaes. Time is short. The project will close at the end of March, so don't delay. As of Friday, March 11, 2016, the total collected and reported was \$5,565. THANK YOU, ALL!!

GFWC Texas Redistricting CHARRETTE 2015

At the Charrette participants were asked three questions:

Do we simply go on as is? If we create different districts, how do they operate? If we do not have districts, how do we operate?

And the answer was:

Leave Our Districts Alone

Just make them more efficient, more worthwhile, more important and a visible part of club life and a more viable part in state activities and participation.

In order to make the Districts function better, we need to:

- · Ease quorum requirements and make it so the districts can do their business.
- . Make it quicker to move up the line so members do not have to wait 6 to 8 years to be President.
- More information online, Webinars and meetings online, maybe even some votes online. Cyber clubs with
 online presence for better outreach.
- · Educate members and public to heritage and culture of oganization on all levels.

Recommendations from the Charrette

District Level

In order to shorten the time it takes to move up the line, we recommend the office of the Second Vice President be replaced with a Membership Chairman appointed by the President-elect after her election and is eligible to serve more than one administration. The rest of the Executive Committee remains the same and there is no change in the selection and time of their service.

To adjust the requirements for a quorum, we recommend that a quorum for the Board of Directors be a majority of the voting members present and that the quorum for the Convention be a majority of the voting members present.

We further recommend that if a District cannot meet minimum requirements it no longer exists and is dissolved. The requirements for being a District is the ability to fill all positions on the Executive Committee (no duplicates), have members willing to take the responsibility of a Chairman for the approved GFWC and TFWC Programs and Projects, and have at least four clubs. All clubs not choosing to affiliate with another district will be considered At-Large Clubs.

State Level

We recommend that the Second Vice President be replaced with a Membership Chairman appointed by the President-elect after her election and is eligible to serve more than one administration. We also recommend that the Secretary become a position appointed by the President-elect and is eligible to serve more than one administration. The rest of the committee remains the same and there is no change in the selection and time of their service.

In order to have district representation on the state level, we recommend that the Chairman of the District Presidents be a member of the Executive Committee. We further recommend that the President-elect appoint an Event Planner who is knowledgeable and experienced in the field of event and meeting planning, has the authority to work with various venues including hotels and can negotiate contracts. She is not a member of the Executive Committee and is eligible to serve more than one administration. We have a Headquarters Building. Let's use it!


In order to establish better communication on all levels by using electronic and social media, establish a greater presence with public relations and to educate and train members and leaders, we recommend creating three new Standing Committees: Communications/Public Relations, Information Technology (IT), Leadership Development. The three Chairmen will work with each other and the other state chairmen, work closely with all districts to keep the membership informed and are eligible to serve more than one administration.

We recommend devising and implementing a Leadership Training Program the completion of which is a requirement for seeking elected state office and a necessity for all Standing Committee Chairmen. It is incumbent upon each state president to ensure that this program is kept up to date, worthwhile, and significant so that "we no longer get behind."

We recommend devising and implementing a program to further develop and define At-Large and Cyber Clubs.



GFWC Members Partnership with CABT Celebrate A LEGISLATIVE VICTORY FOR ROAD SAFETY

GFWC members were asked to take action, to make their voices heard and boy did we answer that call. Several years ago CABT, Coalition Against Bigger Trucks, Regional Director Rick Cowan contacted GFWC Texas member Crystal Hammett, 2014-2016 President of the GFWC Texas District Presidents about the possibility of Texas members joining with CABT to oppose legislation that would allow bigger trucks on U.S. Highways. Seeing the need for action Crystal contacted, then, GFWC Texas 1st Vice President Patti Poe. As it happened Patti was in Virginia with, then, GFWC International President Elect Babs Condon and the rest is GFWC history, GFWC accepted the challenge and took on the fight to prevent bigger trucks on U.S. highways.

Fast forward a few years and a few thousand letters, emails and phone calls to various members of Congress to 2015. Truck size and weight was a center of attention of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. The trucking industry was pushing to increase the length of trucks up to 91 feet and allow an increase in weight to 91,000 pounds. GFWC members joined together to oppose these increases and eventually won the day.

We all recognize the vital role that semitrailer trucks play in the U.S. economy and transportation system, but longer, heavier trucks would endanger motorists, weaken our infrastructure of roads and bridges as well as cost taxpayers billions of dollars every year in highway subsidies. GFWC wasn't having it. We were prepared and educated and focused on the safety of our families and generations to come.

Most observers felt that it was a given that the legislation was going to pass. After all hundreds of thousands of dollars had been spent lobbying for that very thing. Thankfully, leaders emerged on this issue, such as Senators Roger Wicker (R-Miss.) and Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) They joined together in a bipartisan effort to stop double 33s as they are called. They, and every Member of Congress who stood up for public safety and infrastructure, should be congratulated, this is their victory too.

In December 2015, The U.S. House of Representatives released the long-anticipated omnibus appropriations bill to fund the federal government. The controversial provision to allow longer double-trailer trucks, referred to as double 33s, DID NOT make it into the bill. Congratulations, GFWC members, you helped make this happen!

This was a clear victory for highway safety. And GFWC members across the country were a large part of that. Below is some of the facts that CABT had gathered during the fight to stop the increases for semi trailer trucks.

NEW DANGERS:

USDOT FOUND THAT BIGGER TRUCKS BRING NEW DANGERS TO OUR ROADS

• HIGHER CRASH RISK

The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) as well as a MTIC independent study found that multi-trailer trucks— could be expected to experience an 11-percent higher overall fatal crash rate than single-trailer combinations.

• STABILITY PROBLEMS

Heavier trucks tend to have a higher center of gravity because the additional weight, raising the center of gravity increases the risk of rollovers. Triple-trailer trucks are more likely to experience trailer sway and the "crack-the-whip" effect.

CRUMBLING INFRASTRUCTURE

More than half the bridges on the National Highway System are more than 40 years old, and nearly 25 percent are already either structurally deficient or functionally obsolete. Further compounding these problems, it would cost \$121 billion to repair current structurally deficient bridges and allowing heavier trucks on the road could add \$53 billion to that total.

• COSTING TAXPAYERS - BIGGER SUBSIDIES

Trucks already receive \$2 billion in subsidies. Allowing even bigger trucks would make this problem even worse. BIGGER DEFICITS

The most recent federal study to look at the issue showed that the typical 80,000-pound single-trailer truck on the road today only pays for 80 percent of the damage it causes to infrastructure. Even worse, 110,000-pound triple-trailer trucks pay for only 70 percent of their damage, and allowing 97,000-pound single-trailer trucks would result in trucks only paying for 50 percent of



the damage they cause.

 BIGGER TRUCKS MEAN MORE CONGESTION - HISTORY REVEALS A PATTERN Congress last increased the federal weight limit in 1982. Then, as now, those pushing for bigger trucks said it would result in fewer trucks on the road, but that never happened. In fact, the number of trucks registered in the U.S. and the mileage of trucks traveled has steadily increased.

Tell Congress to Fund Programs that Address Violence Against Women - Sign Up For GFWC Legislative Action Center, if you have not already! Be Heard!!

Congress is considering FY 2017 appropriations to fund services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault through the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), and the Family Violence Prevention Services Act (FVPSA). These programs are both cost-effective and lifesaving.

The need for the funds is well documented. According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), an average of 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States – that is over 12 million a year. The National Domestic Violence Counts Census reported that 12,197 requests by victims for help went unanswered on a single day last September due to a lack of funding and resources. The vast majority of the requests (63%) were for safe housing.

The National Alliance to End Sexual Violence revealed that the nation's 1,315 sexual assault programs often lack the resources to meet victims' most basic needs. Almost half of rape crisis centers have a waiting list for counseling services. Wait times can be as long as 3 months in some areas.



April is Autism Awareness Month

Since National Autism Awareness Month began in 1970, the number of individuals diagnosed with autism has grown at an alarming rate. In the 1970s and 1980s, about one out of every 2,000 children was diagnosed with autism. Today, the National Institutes of Health estimates that 1 in 68 children has an Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a developmental disability. ASD is characterized by repetitive patterns of behavior and difficulties with social communication and interaction. There is a wide range of ability among both children and adults with ASD. Some people with ASD are gifted and others need significant levels of support to ensure their well-being. About 25 percent of individuals with ASD are nonverbal but can learn to communicate using other means.

ASD is a lifelong disorder. While there is no known cause or cure, it is treatable. People with ASD can make significant progress through therapy and treatments, and can lead meaningful and productive lives. GFWC's Home Life Community Service Program Partner, Easterseals, provides a wide variety of services that help individuals of all abilities and the families who love them You can learn about Easterseals' autism programs by visiting their website at www.easterseals.com.

Saturday's TFWC Convention Guest Speaker --Pioneer District's own home grown author of 4 Counties . . . The Story of the Last King of Texas, Wayland Long



Wayland Long

DECATUR -- Born in Young County in 1965 to Wayne and Lynn Long, James Wayland Long was raised in Decatur, Texas, a sleepy town 30 minutes from Fort Worth. Back in the 1800s, Decatur was famous for being the headquarters of the famed Wag-goner Ranches. The county seat of Wise County, Decatur is the beginning of Texas' wide-open prairies that sweep west towards Amarillo, and is the jumping off point for some of Texas' largest cattle ranches, and some of the state's richest oil and gas fields back in the day which only add to the romance of a bevy of larger-than-life characters that Long grew up around. Involved in 4-H and competing in livestock and horse shows as a kid, Long eventually graduating into the world of cutting horses, the most disciplined of any equine event. A former National Cutting Horse Association Two-Time World Champion Rider and member of the coveted NCHA Hall of Fame, Long was the youngest ever to achieve both honors. He traveled the country extensively showing horses in the 1980s becoming the consummate asphalt junkie, and parlayed his contacts when he retired from the sport to start his own business.

A "closet historian" and want to-be author, Wayland has always been hooked on all things Texan. When he finally decided to pull the trigger, he drew from his small-town upbringing and created *4 Counties... The Story of The Last King of Texas*. professionalism and huge cattle operations, and thankfully around a whole new generation of Texas personalities.

"There is just something about the privacy of the country. I could not live in a city. We live so far out in the sticks we have to go back towards town just to hunt. I think about the folks that settled Texas before us and realize they were either very tough or very crazy. Or both. Texas is a big place, with big stories, that are screaming to be shared. Everybody either loves Texas, or they love to hate Texas. No in between. I have had US military veterans tell me they could draw an outline of Texas in the sand, and Iraqi children would point, smile, and say 'Texas'. General Santa Anna's unforgivable atrocities at the Alamo, before Sam Houston whipped him at San Jacinto, forged a mindset in Texas that will always be the navigational tool of pride in the hearts of anybody who was bred, born, and raised here. I honestly think it is a DNA kind of thing. Texans don't even know how to quit. Even when they lose. I'd rather be a fencepost in Texas, than the Mayor of New York City and I want what I write to reflect that. I either want you to be proud you are from here, or be mad at your momma and daddy cause you aren't from here."

James Wayland Long has been self employed for over 25 years and is the President of 2-L Custom Trucks out of Poolville, TX. Wayland and his wife Carrie have 3 grown children: Libby Long, Abby Long a junior at TCU and Binion Long. Wayland was raised in Decatur and graduated from Decatur High School in 1983 and Tarleton State University in 1987.
