The gift from the dinner was so very special and one that will always remind me of a special time with some very special sweet women.



The Woman's Club of Cotulla was organized in October 1923 and chartered in November 1923. There were 22 charter members. Two of our members are granddaughters of one of these charter members; the daughter-in-law of one of the present members marks the fourth generation of membership in the Woman's Club.

Seeing the need for books for the local school children and community in general, the Woman's Club sought to establish the first free public library in Cotulla. Through the persistent efforts of the Woman's Club, the first public library was built in 1937. The Club helped obtain and borrow over 100 books from the San Antonio Public Library. The Club continues to assist the local library which in 1973 was moved to its current location and is now known as the Alexander Memorial Library.

#### Spotlight Cont.

The Woman's Club of Cotulla also had an influence in our local Veteran's park which sits in front of the La Salle County Courthouse. The Club would often have fundraisers to help with the upkeep of the park and members would prepare care packages for the many local men of Cotulla that were deployed.

The Club was also influential in the upkeep of Cotulla, in the 1940's when there was no trash pickup for the town, the Woman's Club arranged and paid for the trash pickup in the whole town. The Club was also responsible for getting the first street signs installed on the main streets of Cotulla. In the 1980's the Club assisted in bringing in the first EMS service to the area. In 2018-19 the Club has adopted two miles of highway and will participate in the "Don't Mess with Texas" Campaign. In 1960, Nelda Watson, the President at that time, decided that students needed to be recognized for academic achievement similar to students that were recognized for athletics and band. She organized the first Honors Banquet. In 2019, the Woman's Club will sponsor its 59th Annual Honors Banquet. During the Banquet the Club honors the top three students from each grade 9-12 and recognizes the members of the National Honor Society and the Middle School's National Junior Honor Society members. The scholarship program began as a money loan program in 1985; the club is now able to give three scholarships and one high English award to graduating seniors going on to higher education. More recently the Club strives to help those people who are marginalized in the community raising awareness and monies for Child Abuse Awareness, Domestic Violence Awareness, Dating Violence Awareness and Human Trafficking. Monetary and in kind donations are collected for the Wintergarden Women's Shelter and the Children's Alliance of South Texas, a Child Advocacy Center.

During the 2018-19 Club year the Woman's Club of Cotulla will participate in three of the Grand Initiatives proposed by the International Administration. We will plant trees for Arbor Day, donate blankets, books, and stuffed animals to the Child Advocacy Center for the MLK National Day of Service and donate Dr.

Seuss books to a local daycare that offers free daycare to young mothers who are still in school.

#### Merry Christmas!

Work at the TFWC Headquarters' Building has been ongoing and busy as the TFWC Historical Foundation Trustees oversee the work of the staff. The work includes both maintenance work and the work to ensure the building is shining when GFWC Texas hosts the GFWC International Convention. The facilities manager was notified in June by the Austin Fire Marshal and the City of Austin that there was not a certificate of occupancy for hosting events in the building. The facilities manager has continued to work with the fire marshal's office. In October, we were granted a temporary occupancy load of 600 guests. If we plan to have more than 300 guests, we must hire a fire watch to be onsite during the event. The facility manager and I will meet with the Austin Fire Marshal in an effort to determine what will be required to obtain a permanent certificate of occupancy. The Past Presidents Pavers were moved, the broken stones repaired, and new stones engraved for the presidents who did not have stones. The pavers are in place and look great. The ballroom floor was refinished using a new product and looks wonderful. The travertine floors have been deep cleaned, honed and sealed. The parlor has been refurbished. Five chairs were reupholstered. Two new sofas and two new chairs were purchased. A new carpet runner was installed on the stairway in the entry. We continue to host weddings and receptions in the building. The facilities manager is always looking other potential clients. There have been several interesting groups using our building as a venue for their events including Austin Ballet shooting their season brochure, The Macallan Manor tasting, and a four day yoga conference.




