





### **Around the State**

Carolyn McLeod was visiting the TFWC Heritage Club in Comanche, Texas. While at the meeting, she saw the quilt pieces of a WW II quilt and heard the story of how it came to be made. Sharon McKinzie is a member of the TFWC Heritage Club, Comanche, Texas, Pioneer District and the quilt pieces are part of her family history which she was sharing with her club. Ms. McLeod said, "I saw the quilt pieces when I visited the club in April as their speaker. The pieces are a wonderful window into the past and what clubwomen and women from the community did to help out in the war effort." Carolyn thought the story would be of interest to the ladies of GFWC Texas and wanted to share the story with everyone.

#### The WW II Quilt

Life at home during a long and difficult war overseas placed untold strains on those left behind, but they carried on in brave support, sometimes in unpublicized ways.

Such was the case in the tiny community of Mercer's Gap near Comanche, Texas. "The Gap," with its elementary school, thriving church, and two cemeteries, was a favorite gathering-place for country folk. Out of their fellowship came the "Airplane Quilt."

Several years ago, my husband Paul's mother, Udell Williford McKinzie Akin, revealed the partially-completed quilt stored in her old trunk. She shared the story of wartime quilting "bees," where women of the community gathered in the schoolhouse or church to make quilts in a setting of camaraderie and sharing for those bearing the tasks of housekeeping, child-raising, and – in many cases – ranch and farm work, throughout the absence of their sons and husbands.

Someone came up with a unique and patriotic design: airplanes! And so each quilter stitched a plane of one color or another onto a square and embroidered her name across the fuselage.

Hooray! The war ended before the quilt was completed, but its segments recall a cheerful interlude softening a mournful era.

Ms. McKinzie wrote, "Paul and I assured his mother that we would not complete the quilting process; the treasure was not ours to own. We've begun distributing the squares to the families we can locate. Our local heritage center and museum will accept the squares of those we cannot identify. Soon there will be public displays telling the quilt's unique story". Thank You Sharon McKinzie and Carolyn McLeod for sharing the story with the rest of GFWC Texas.









#### Brenham's Fortnightly Club Holds Annual Book Sale!



With more than 90,000 books and miscellaneous items offered for sale, the Brenham Fortnightly Club's 2019 Used Book Sale was another roaring success – generating nearly \$17,000 in sales. Almost all the items were priced at \$1, \$2 or \$3 with some collectibles individually priced. Another \$9,600 was raised through solicitations from local businesses and individuals. Over the past four years, the Club's efforts have raised more than \$100,000 for the Library.

The Club accepts books year-round at its Book House location near downtown Brenham. Members volunteer hundreds of hours annually sorting the donations by topic and pricing, boxing and storing the books for the annual sale. The City provides the Book House space as well as an additional storage building at no cost to the Club.

This annual fundraiser, benefitting Brenham's Nancy Carol Roberts Memorial Library, began in a very small way with just a few tables of books displayed at the library. The concept of collecting donated books for the annual sale grew over the years until the Club's annual sale had to be moved to a County Fairgrounds building.

It's hard to imagine that the 14 ladies who, in 1895, chartered the Fortnightly Club and met to study music, poetry, history and literature, would have had any idea that their small beginning would lead to the effort accomplished today.


