125 Years Strong!



Monday Review Club of Hillsboro, Texas

125 years ago in 1895, women could not vote or drive, but a group of head strong and civic-minded ladies in Hillsboro, Texas joined together to form the Monday Review Club. They chose the name for two reasons: The first reason to meet on Monday was to share and eat leftovers from their family's Sunday meal. The second reason was that most of them had paid helpers in their homes on Mondays enabling the ladies to be away from their homes on Monday afternoons. They walked or came by wagons, coming any way they could to arrive on time at 606 North Franklin, the home of Mary Phillips. This home is still occupied in January, 2020.

In 1899, the Monday Review Club decided to join forces with the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs in order to strengthen their goals and voices in making their city, state and world a better place for all to live. Active in their community, their club donated playground equipment for the city park, formed the first Girl Scout troop in Hillsboro, and was instrumental in forming their city library. During World Wars One and Two, they were active in rolling bandages, collecting scrap metal, and even took in ironing to help the war efforts. Membership through the years has included a "Who's Who" of outstanding women of the community.

On Monday, January 6, 2020, along with our club members. GFWC/Texas State Executive Board members, Capitol District Club members from other cities, dignitaries and numerous friends joined together to celebrate this momentous anniversary. County Judge Justin Lewis proclaimed January as Monday Review Club Month in Hill County. Celebrating with a patriotic theme of red, white and blue, the meeting was called to order, followed by prayer by Betty Lowrance, the wife of

Hillsboro former mayor. Pledges to the American and Texas flags were given, and special guests were acknowledged. Mayor Andrew Smith presented the club with a proclamation honoring Monday Review for their accomplishments and recognition and welcomed everyone to Hillsboro.

Other recognitions included a letter from former President George W. Bush, a letter from Senator John Cornyn, a letter from U. S. Representative Roger Williams, Proclamations from Texas Governor Greg Abbott, Texas State Senator Brian Birdwell (who also was in attendance), and Texas State Representative Cody Harris, Hill County Judge Justin Lewis, Hill County Commissioner's Court, and GFWC/Texas State President Carol Habgood presented both a congratulatory letter and document. The club felt very honored by all of these messages.

Former Mayor Will Lowrance told the story of how the women of Monday Review "saved" our local courthouse in the 1930's by surrounding the building, arm in arm, refusing to let State Officials from changing the façade of the building. The State relented and our beautiful historical courthouse was saved and is the same today.



Following the welcome ,GFWC/Texas State President Carol Habgood responded and explained Federation and how our clubs and state work together and other states and internationally. President-elect Dixie Gilley of Capitol District explained the role of the ten districts under the auspices of GFWC/Texas and what it means to be a member. Jeri Harkins, Past Capitol District President, presented a brief history of Monday Review Club and how the club has been an integral part of Hillsboro history. She then introduced Dr. Chul W. Chang who is a professor in the Music Department of Hill College in Hillsboro. Dr. Chang shared his story of growing up in Korea . He then shared his musical talent singing two songs – the latter being "I'm Proud to be an American". Guest speaker Patti Poe, Past GFWC/Texas President, presented her feelings regarding "Why I'm a Member of Federation" and stating that it is a "Sisterhood" for women who want their lives to count by helping our world to be a better place to live. The event concluded with the Monday Review Past President Debra Rochat thanking the approximately fifty guests who attended for sharing this special occasion and encouraged women of our community to join with them to continue the legacy begun 125 years before by women who cared and wanted to make a difference. It was a wonderful historical day in the life of Monday Review and Hillsboro, Texas.

Funeral services for Margaret Kriegel, 93, of Giddings, Texas were held at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 20, 2020 at First Baptist Church in Giddings with Rev. Mark Nygard officiating. Burial followed in the Giddings City Cemetery.

Margaret Kriegel, a long-time resident of Giddings, Texas, died February 17, 2020 at Brookdale Gaines Ranch, Austin, Texas. She was born December 7, 1926 in Hooker, Oklahoma, the oldest of three children of Rev. Max Studtmann and Charlotte Luetzow Studtmann. Margaret was baptized December 25, 1926 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Hooker by her father and confirmed March 17, 1940 at First Lutheran Church in Muskogee, Oklahoma, also by her father.

In April of 1941, her father received a call to Immanuel Lutheran Church and the family moved to Giddings. Margaret graduated from Giddings High School and began working at Citizens State Bank in Giddings

She met Leonard Kriegel in 1946 at a Walther League Convention and became engaged in March of 1947. Her father did not believe in long engagements, and Leonard and Margaret were married by her father on June 8, 1947 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings. This marriage was blessed with three daughters, Patricia, Deborah, and Gretchen.

Margaret, along with her husband Leonard, owned and operated a retail clothing store named Leonard's and Margaret's, in Giddings for 45 years. In addition, she was very involved in many community and church organizations.

Active in her church, Margaret served in numerous capacities, including Bible class teacher, choir director, and organist. She also was a church council officer for many years. She organized the Giddings Associates of the Seton Hospital Development board in 1981 and served in various officer positions. Margaret also was an active member of the Lee County Heritage Society, Rotary Club, and Giddings Chamber of Commerce. She was honored by the Giddings Chamber of Commerce with the "Outstanding Citizen Award in 1983" and the "Outstanding Lifetime Achievement Award in 2006."

Margaret was a member of the Giddings Study Club since 1958. She served as president, parliamentarian, and was honored as a Life Member. She also was honored as a Life Member of the Texas Federation of Women's Club. As a member of the TFWC Capitol District, she served as president, vice-president, parliamentarian, and chaired many committees throughout the years. While on the TFWC executive board, Margaret served as secretary and treasurer. Margaret also served as parliamentarian for 30 years over a span of 15 state presidents. She was awarded the TFWC's "Today's Woman Outstanding Clubwoman Volunteer" in 1991 and the "Jennie June Award" for outstanding service in 2017.

Margaret dearly loved her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. She valued spending time with them and engaging in games, reading, and other fun activities. She lovingly sent cards to all family members for birthdays and holidays. She enjoyed writing letters and receiving letters and cards from her great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her loving husband, Leonard Kriegel; parents, Rev. Max and Charlotte Studtmann; father-in-law and mother-in-law, K. Gus and Alvina Kriegel.

Margaret is survived by daughters, Dr. Patricia Koch of Austin, Deborah Gaeke and husband Robert of San Antonio, and Gretchen Rodstrom and husband Barry of Giddings; brother, Dr. Rev. Robert H. Studtmann and wife Barbara of Amarillo; six grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren.

Records are sketchy, but so far the first mention of the Past District Presidents Club is for an evening meeting during the 66th Annual 'Meeting' May 13-15, 1963 at the Baker Hotel in Dallas. According to the CALL, President Mrs. A.T. Carlton hosted a meeting in her suite at 9:30 P.M. for the "Past District Presidents Club of Texas".

Now, 57 years later the club has evolved into a scheduled morning meeting during the state Board of Directors Meeting in the fall and the state Convention in the spring. Breakfast is served and a business meeting follows. This club has become a haven for those women no longer leading their districts; the outgoing president, if she has moved and/or if her club has disbanded or even if her district has folded.

Because she pays per capita dues to the Past District Presidents Club, this valuable leader can still participate in GFWC Texas and GFWC functions, receive Federation materials and participate in Federation activities. Membership is open to any member who has served as a District President such as the current class of District Presidents or from any previous class.


Nowadays we raise money and otherwise participate in Federation projects, support the current district presidents with an annual monetary contribution, work with the state leadership for ways our group can better assist programs and projects, and we continue to contribute to the state scholarship fund.

Because of our history, participation and support to past district presidents for continued club membership over the last 57 years, we are asking for inclusion as a recognized club in the Membership Classification category in our bylaws. In addition we have begun compiling a comprehensive membership roster with the name and contact information of each member as well as the district she represented, the dates she served as president, the state president at the time and the name of her class. For example I was President of Trinity District 1994-96, Dorothy S. Kemp was state president and we were Kemps Keys.

Our meetings are informal and lively yet we take care of business. At our next meeting we will elect officers for 2020-22, recap our activities for this year and enjoy each other's company.

All GFWC Texas members are invited to attend the 123rd Annual Convention. However, like most Convention bodies, only certain members are designated as delegates, as specified in the bylaws, Article VII. Voting delegates attend Convention as voting delegates. Although entitled to vote in several capacities, a voting member shall have but one vote. Members who do not receive a vote attend as a non-voting member and may take part in discussion, but not make a motion.

All eligible voting members shall be certified by the Credentials Chairman. Credentials cards will be issued at the Registration desk. The form to be submitted to obtain credentials is included in this Call to Convention.

Club level:

- One delegate for each fifteen (15) members or major portions thereof, elected from per capita club membership whose names are on the roster of GFWC Texas as least two months prior to the Convention. This does not include the club president as she is a member of the Board of Directors and is eligible to vote by virtue of that position.
- One delegate from each accredited Juniorette Club.
- One accredited delegate from each ten (10) clubs, or major portion thereof in a City/County Federation

Board Level: All members of the GFWC Texas Board of Directors are eligible to vote. Members of the Board are:

• Elected and appointed members:

State elected and appointed officers; District elected and appointed officers; Trustees; Scholarship Representatives; Past State Presidents; State Life Members and Honorary members; and Club Presidents.

Other Appointed members:

State Chairmen of GFWC Community Service Programs, Advancement Areas, Special Projects, and Awards and Contests; Chairmen of Texas Programs; Chairmen of all GFWC Texas Standing Committees; Members of GFWC Texas Legislation, Bylaws, Resolutions, Finance, and Life Membership Committees; and GFWC Texas Convention chairmen.

Proposed amendments to TFWC bylaws:

Amendment 1:

Amend **ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP**, *SECTION 1*-Classification, A by adding a second sentence: The TFWC Past District Presidents' Club is a general club.

Current Wording	Proposed Amendment	If Adopted Will Read	
SECTION I – Classification Membership in TFWC shall consist of Women's Clubs whose work and purpose are germane to the objects of TFWC.
