They not only operated the town library prior to World War I, but had walks laid, trees planted, water fountains installed, and purchased chairs for the school auditorium. The club purchased four lots adjacent to the business section of downtown and cleared them

Did You Know?

- * The Pioneer Woman statue is located at Texas Woman's University, Denton, Texas and was designed by Leo Friedlander. The statue was dedicated in 1938 for the centennial of Texas independence and was given by the state of Texas to TWU.
- * The GFWC Motto *Unity in Diversity* was authored by Ella Dietz Clymer. Speaking to the delegates at the first GFWC Conference she said, "We look for unity, but unity in diversity. We hope that you will enrich us by your varied experiences ..." The aptness of the motto is evidence in the diverse interests and methods of GFWC members, who have implemented a broad range of programs and projects tailored to meet the needs of their communities.
- *The red rose was officially adopted as the Federation Flower at the Council Meeting in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, May 1940. It was selected from suggestions sent in by various clubs.
- *In 1922, Katherine Lee Bates' song "America the Beautiful" was chosen as the official song because of it "is a song of dignity and beauty, easily sung, and reflects the true spirit of America and the ideals of this Federation.
