Candidate for the Office of President-elect......Novella Byrd

Novella Byrd joined the GFWC Woman's Club of Cotulla in 2014. She has served as Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and President at the club level. At the district level she has served in a variety of capacities including District Reporting Chairman, Technology Coordinator, President-elect and Alamo District President, serving as President of the District Presidents during her tenure. At the state level, Novella served as Juniorette Coordinator, state Reporting Chairman and attended the GFWC LEADS training in 2019. She currently serves as GFWC Texas First Vice President. Novella is also currently serving as the South Central Region President's Aide.

Novella retired from Cotulla ISD after 28 years of service as an educator and librarian. She currently resides in Cotulla, Texas with her husband of 32 years, Teddy.

Kathy Horak Smith has been active in GFWC Texas since she became a member of the Stephenville 20th Century Club in 1999, serving as first vice president, president-elect and president. As a member, she has also served on the Stephenville Public Library Board and the Stephenville Community Garden Planning Committee.

Kathy has served as Pioneer District president, President Pro-Tem, President-elect, Second Vice President, Pioneer District Scholarship Representative to TFWC and as Education Chairman.

At the State Level, Kathy has served as Photography Chairman (2016-2020), President of the District Presidents (2018-2020), Education and Library State Chairman (2020-2022), and on the Long Range Planning Committee (2018-2020). She is currently serving as Second Vice President and Dean of Membership and in that capacity is the Liaison Officer for the Lone Star Administrative District.
